ISMTA Conference Recap from Deb Meier

This year I had to ask myself "Is the ISMTA Conference for me?" Currently it looks like I'm phasing out my teaching since I'm down to two students, and I had to wonder if I should even bother with attending the conference. But, I am very glad that I did. Not only did I hear some great concerts, I attended worthwhile sessions that continue to speak to me, and I met some new Illinois teachers that attend regularly but I'd never had conversations with them in the past. I also met one of the Illinois MusicLink teachers that I've corresponded with but didn't personally know. Put this on your list for next year and attend the conference! It was also great to be with our local group; six of us there: Joe, Gill, Abby, Lisa Cripe, LeAnn, and myself.

Here are 2 of the handouts from sessions I attended: handout 2. The Group Piano session had some great ideas if you do any type of group teaching, even if it's only 2-4 times per year which is a great way to cover some AIM Theory and also have performance sessions so that your students get used to performing in front of others. Some teachers do a monthly group lesson, and another teacher has her students come for both a private lesson and a group lesson all in the same week. Another session titled Symphony of Knowledge: AMA (Ask Me Anything) with Illinois Piano Maestros, including Jennifer Cohen, was very informative. If you don't already know 2024 ISMTA Teacher of the Year, Lynette Zelis, she is a go-getter! She has such a passion for teaching and is full of energy. Lynette oversees studios for 24 other music instructors and currently has 3 locations. She has been one of our ISMTA Presidents in past years, and she is a delight to know!

Another thing to know is that the AIM Syllabus Committee has been hard at work. They hope to have the new Repertoire List published and ready for use for the 2025-2026 teaching year. Also on the horizon is a "new level," called "Level 12 Honors." Because some of the teachers have students that complete Level 12 at a younger age, (8th-11th grade), this level is made up of harder repertoire so that the student can keep studying harder pieces. There is no theory to go along with it. If a student wants to learn lots of music, they can even do Level 12 Honors two or three years in a row.

Frederic Chiu, Conference Artist, was back this year. He presented the second of 3 "Classical Smackdown" where composers face off in head to head comparisons with listeners voting for

their favorite composer. Last year the two composers were Mendelssohn and Chopin. This year's concert featured Debussy and Prokofiev. Stay tuned! I'd love to hear the 3rd in the series between Bach vs. Philip Glass! Who knows, maybe Frederic will be featured at another ISMTA Conference.

If you weren't at the conference, you missed another amazing performance of Piano Duets by Female Composers, featuring our own GAE members, Gill Cerbin and Abby Hayden. I loved the program and have heard it twice and I'd love to hear it again. They did a great job!

One more thing: To let you know of the wide variety of topics, some of the others had to do with--Reimagining Piano Instruction for the Young Beginner; Navigating Hypermobility: Assisting Young Pianists with Double-Jointed Fingers; The Evolution of Piano Technique from Beethoven to Liszt: Revisiting the Neglected Exercises of Clementi, Cramer, Hummel, and Czerny (I liked this one! We had to come up with our own fingering for some exercises and then we got to compare them to the composers original fingering, and two students' fingering...showing that fingering is ALWAYS important); Evolutionary Entrepreneurialism: Grow Your Studio One "Yes" At a Time (another good session!); The Perfect Virtual Recital: How to Create Dazzling Student Performance Videos (by Chris Goldston). I hated to miss this but went to hear Gill and Abbey; Worship Service Improvisation Skills for Classical Pianists (This was another one I really enjoyed.); and Shape the Brain!

So many (and there were a few more) that you can't attend everything, but I've noticed there is usually something for everyone! Please consider attending the ISMTA Conference next year at this time. It is so worthwhile and it's bound to charge your battery!
